Special sight in Herdecke - WAR MEMORIAL

The war memorial sculpture is a mourning soldier at the Goethestreet in Herdecke.

The Sculpture commemorates above all soldiers from Herdecke who died in the world war (1939 -1945).

In addition, there is an important sentence on the stone tablet "Preserve peace and freedom."



The soldier on the picture seems exhausted and thoughtful.

To the left and right side are two stone pillars, which are crowned with a cross. On each pillar is a bronze sword, which is aligned downwards

On the left and right pillars are the names of the fallen soldiers. The names of the person who died in the war are engraved on the bronze plaque.

The viaduct in Herdecke

Here you can see the so called "Herdecker viaduct". It was built in 1875 and the ending of this journey was in 1878. The first opening was on 15th May, 1879 so the viaduct is 140 years old.

Now it is used by the Wuppertal Nordbahn, a train that passes the viaduct frequently.

This bridge made of stone is 313 metres long, 8 metres high and 29.33 metres tall

The bridge is compeletly mad of stone with some rails on to. It is a stone arch construction with 12 arches in total, you have 11 coloumns.

The viaduct is one of the most famoust sights in Herdecke.

Except its beauty the Ruhr is a really good and loved spot to hang out with friends. The location is used by the youth, families, grandparents and children but you aren't allowed to swim in the Ruhr because of the current.

Hensteysee

Lake Hengstey is a 4.2 km long and 296 m wide reservoir operated by the Ruhrverband. The lake has a water storage capacity of 3.3 million cbm and a water surface of 1.36 sq. km. The construction period was two years from 1927-1929.

On the northern side the lake borders on the Ardey Mountains and on the southern side on Hagen. The lake is named after the adjacent Hagen district Hengstey. It begins approximately at the level of the Syburg Bridge, about 1km after the mouth of the Lenne River, and ends at the dam of the Hengstey run-of-river power plant.

On the north bank of the Hengsteysee is the Köpchenwerk, this is a pumped storage power plant with an artificially created upper basin and the Hengsteysee as lower basin. In addition, the lake is also used for water purification.

The lake is a popular recreational area, around which a foot and bicycle path with a length of about 6 km leads. In the summer, the Hengsteysee is sailed by a pleasure boat named Freiherr von Stein.

The lake is also used as a water sports area by rowers, sailors and canoeists, but it is not a bathing lake.

In the middle of the Hengsteysee is the ruin of the Niedernhofen Castle, about 150 meters south of the power plant. The Mäuseturm, which can still be seen today, is the bridgehead of the old pedestrian bridge, that led over the Ruhr.
